

Foundation Launches New Programs

The 2010-11 year saw the initiation of three new Foundation programs:

- Elementary Music Teacher grants Thanks to an anonymous donor at the Greater Cedar Rapids Community Foundation, each elementary school music teacher in the school district received \$100 annually to support their classroom.
- Corridor Goes Casual for Kids The school district participated in the Corridor Goes Casual for Kids program. In response, the Foundation was the recipient of \$1,835 in donations from faculty and staff choosing to dress casual on September 1, 2011.
- <u>UICĈU Welcome Back Students</u> The University of Iowa Community Credit Union sponsored Welcome Back Students events at elementary schools. Each participating school received \$500 to spend on school-related needs.


Giacoletto Foundation Continues Support for Schools

The Foundation is proud of its continuing partnership with the John P. & Lawrence J. Giacoletto Foundation – the largest donor to the Cedar Rapids Community Schools Foundation. This partnership, now in its fourth year, provided more than \$50,000 in student- and school-based funding in 2010-11. The contribution underwrites two annual programs:

<u>Student Enrichment Fund Grants</u> – Provided in the fall to teachers who apply for classroom-based funding. Grants of up to \$100 are provided for such expenditures as: library books, calculators, chess sets, smartboards, and activity boxes.

<u>School Project Grants</u> – Provided in the spring to teachers seeking larger, capital needs. Grants range from \$500 to \$10,000. A sample of grants funded in 2011 includes:

- Harding Middle School Autistic students sensory room
- Grant Early Childhood Center Preschool technology
- Metro High School Robotics in the classroom
- Taylor Elementary School Outdoor classroom

Hills Bank & Trust Funds Field Trips

The Cedar Rapids Community Schools Foundation was honored during the 2010-11 school year to receive \$14,520 in funding from Hills Bank and Trust Company to support the *Kids in the Community* field trip program. This donation provided Cedar Rapids public school students the opportunity to experience hands-on learning at many of the cultural, educational, and historical sites in and around our community.

A total of 67 field trip grants were awarded to schools to benefit nearly 6,000 K-12 students. Field trips included visits to such

venues as the Cedar Rapids Museum of Art, Carl & Mary Koehler History Center, Grant Wood Studio and Visitors Center at 5 Turner Alley, Mississippi River Museum, State Capitol, Wickiup Nature Center, Hancher Auditorium, Indian Creek Nature Center and the Iowa Children's Museum. Grants were awarded to the following schools: Arthur, Cleveland, Garfield, Grant, Grant Wood, Harrison, Hiawatha, Hoover, Johnson, Kenwood, Madison, Monroe, Nixon, Polk, Taylor, Truman, Viola Gibson and Wright elementary schools; Harding, McKinley, Roosevelt and Wilson middle schools; Jefferson, Kennedy, Metro and Washington high schools.



Pearson Grant Provides Extra Programs

The Grant Early Childhood Center again this year received a \$12,000 grant from Pearson to fund its before/after school program, with a new summer component added this year. The grant underwrote educational enrichment classes and activities for students age 3-7. Program topics included science, math, reading, and the arts. The summer program provided students and their families the opportunity to participate in outdoor fitness classes, a summer reading program, and several science activities with field trips. Pearson has supported this program since 2010.

Runners 'Lace Up' for Schools

An atmosphere of energy and excitement prevailed for more than 500 young people and adults at the 4th Annual "Lace Up for Learning" 5K, 10K, and Family Fun Run May 7, 2011 at Kingston Stadium. Proceeds benefit the Foundation's funding of school projects, programs, equipment needs, and curriculum supports that enhance the educational experiences for student of all ages.

The event is known for its one-of-a-kind Olympic style finish and offers a 10K course. Schools continue to offer running clubs as a way to introduce students to fitness and train for the race. The Foundation is pleased that many parents join their children on the course, making "Lace Up for Learning" a great family event. New to the Race this year was chip timing. With equipment donated by the Cedar Valley Running Association, chip timing requires that athletes wear a small, lightweight chip (tied on shoelaces) that uniquely identifies them as they cross strategically placed, electronic mats in order to manage electronically the task of collecting and processing results at the end of the race.

SAFE Fund Assists Students in Need

In response to the devastation caused by the 2008 flood, the Cedar Rapids Community Schools Foundation established the School Flood Relief Fund. The fund was designed to address immediate needs of the 1,800 students, 100 staff, and schools affected by the Flood. While the immediate and basic needs of many have been met, ongoing challenges persist. In response, the Foundation initiated a program in 2011 called the Sports, Academics, Fine Arts and Enrichment (SAFE) Activities for Kids. The SAFE program offers financial assistance for participation in extra-curricular activities to at-risk/low income students, and/or those who were affected by the 2008 flood, and/or those attending a school located in a flood-affected neighborhood. In its first year, the SAFE program was pleased to assist in removing financial barriers related to program fees, equipment needs, and transportation costs. Supported by The Witwer Trust and the Greater Cedar Rapids Community Foundation, nearly \$16,000 was disbursed to enrich student's lives and positively impact their educational experience though participation in school-sponsored extra-curricular activities.

Grants Support Professional Growth

The Cedar Rapids Community Schools Foundation presented a total of \$1,260 to Cedar Rapids Community School District educators to further their educational professional devel-

opment.

 Stephanie Rose, librarian at Madison and Harrison Elementary Schools, received the Ernie Pence Memorial Grant. She took a course in learning resource centers and services at the University of North Texas.

- Madison Elementary School first grade teachers, Heather Hess and Nikki Barker, used their grant to purchase a classroom library of books to accompany their dialogic reading guides.
- Stacy Haynes-Moore, a Jefferson language arts teacher, enrolled in a University of Iowa graduate workshop on digital media for high school journalism advisors.
- Franklin Middle School music teacher, Valerie Shanley, attended the Midwest Clinic of the International Band and Orchestra Conference.
- Joan Steinmetz, Kennedy High School science teacher, enrolled at the Colorado School of Mines for a course titled Colorado Ecosystem Field Studies.

Staff Returns Support to Foundation


Foundation Reports Successful Year

The Foundation completed its fiscal year on September 30, 2011 and is pleased to report contributions of \$245,418 and the granting of scholarships and awards of \$15,800. The portfolio return in 2011 was positive .96%. The Foundation maintains three years of projected operating funds in CDs, cash, or money market investments. This conservative approach has helped the Foundation preserve its principal investments during a down-turn in the economy.
